## **Program Outcomes**

## **Under-graduate Programs**

- **Knowledge:** The graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith should have latest information and knowledge of their field of study and they should be able to understand the relationship between individual, society, nature, and knowledge.
- Skills: The graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith should be equipped with traditional as well as modern skills. - Attitude: The graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith should have well-developed scientific temperament. They will understand their responsibility towards rural society and contribute towards its betterment in whatever capacity they can. They should have equal respect for physical labour and intellectual labour.

## **Post-graduate Programs**

- **Knowledge:** The post-graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith should be able to understand the entire process of knowledge generation. They should have developed critical faculties to examine each aspects of social world to come to a better understanding of the self and society. They should be able to critically evaluate socio-political, economic and technological changes occurring in the society. They are expected to have a well-informed opinion on contemporary issues of the society. They should have the understanding of their responsibility of rebuilding the society on Gandhian principles.
- **Skills:** The post-graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to have different skill sets acquired through experiential and experimental learning to meet the challenges of society. They should be equipped with traditional and modern skill sets to enable themselves to self-sufficient in some of their daily requirements. They should also be equipped with socially productive skills.
- Attitude: The post-graduates of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to possess the spirit of critical inquiry which they should use in all walks of life. They should have in-depth understanding of social problems and are expected to offer alternative solution to those problems based on Gandhian principles. They should be willing to work for the betterment of the rural society.

## **Research Programs**

- · Knowledge: The research scholars of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to create new and relevant knowledge in their field of research. They are expected to have in-depth knowledge of their field. They should have the understanding their research topic or question does not exist in isolation, it exist in a complicated web of relationships with wider world. They should be understand and explain clearly the connection of micro- and macroproblems of society and they should establish this connection in their research. The research scholars of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to conduct empirical research on rural questions and provide concrete alternative solutions. They should have ability and critical-analytical resources critique the market-driven solutions offered to basic questions of society be it education, healthcare, economic activity, or environment. They should offer solutions which are sustainable and can be implement with minimum use of resources.
- **Skills:** The research scholars of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to have all the critical and methodological tools which are used to undertake in-depth research. They should be linguistic competency to present their research in most effective manner. They are expected to developed

skills which can help them to interact with all sections of society without any feeling of awkwardness.

• Attitude: The research scholars of Gujarat Vidyapith are expected to understand that substantial research is required in the rural societies to come to a credible and working solution. They are expected to understand that as mainstream education system has neglected the questions of rural society, it becomes their responsibility to keep their focus of research on problems faced by rural society. They should have the understanding that research should provide alternative and sustainable solutions too apart from creating new knowledge.
